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ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY

In an effort to make ice hockey a more desirable and rewarding experience for all participants, USA Hockey instituted a zero tolerance policy beginning with the 1992-93 season. This policy requires all players, coaches, officials, team officials and administrators and parents/spectators to maintain a sportsmanlike and educational atmosphere before, during and after all USA Hockey-sanctioned games.

Thus, the following points of emphasis must be implemented by all referees and linesmen:

Players

A minor penalty for unsportsmanlike conduct (zero tolerance) shall be assessed whenever a player:

- Openly disputes or argues any decision by an official.
- Uses obscene or vulgar language at any time, including any swearing, even if it is not directed at a particular person.
- Visually demonstrates any sign of dissatisfaction with an official's decision. Any time that a player persists in any of these actions, they shall be assessed a misconduct penalty. A game misconduct shall result if the player continues such action.

Coaches

A minor penalty for unsportsmanlike conduct (zero tolerance) shall be assessed whenever a coach:

- Openly disputes or argues any decision by an official.
- Uses obscene or vulgar language in a boisterous manner to anyone at any time.
- Visually displays any sign of dissatisfaction with an official's decision including standing on the boards or standing in the bench doorway with the intent of inciting the officials, players or spectators.
- Any time that a coach persists in any of these actions, he/she shall be assessed a game misconduct penalty.

Officials are required to conduct themselves in a businesslike, sportsmanlike, impartial and constructive manner at all times. The actions of an official must be above reproach. Actions such as "baiting" or inciting players or coaches are strictly prohibited.

Officials are ambassadors of the game and must always conduct themselves with this responsibility in mind.

Parents/Spectators

The game will be stopped by game officials when parents/spectators displaying inappropriate and disruptive behavior interfere with other spectators or the game. The game officials will identify violators to the coaches for the purpose of removing parents/ spectators from the spectator's viewing and game area. Once removed, play will resume. Lost time will not be replaced and violators may be subject to further disciplinary action by the local governing body.

This inappropriate and disruptive behavior shall include:

- Use of obscene or vulgar language in a boisterous manner to anyone at any time.
- Taunting of players, coaches, officials or other spectators by means of baiting, ridiculing, threat of physical violence or physical violence.
- Throwing of any object in the spectators viewing area, players bench, penalty box or on ice surface, directed in any manner as to create a safety hazard.

USA HOCKEY PARTICIPANT CODE OF CONDUCT

- 1. No swearing or abusive language on the bench, in the rink, or at any team function.
- 2. No lashing out at any official no matter what the call is.
- Anyone who receives a penalty will skate directly to the penalty box.
- 4. Fighting will not be tolerated.
- 5. There will be no drinking, smoking, chewing of tobacco, or use of illegal substances at any team function.
- 6. I will conduct myself in a befitting manner at all facilities (ice rink, hotel, restaurant, etc.) during any team function.
- 7. I understand that players or team officials who cannot abide by these rules or who violates them will be subject to further disciplinary action.

- 10. Cheer good plays for all participants, avoid booing opponents
- 11. Cheer in a positive manner and encourage fair play
- 12. Not lean over or pound on the glass, the glass surrounding the ice is part of the playing area
- 13. Support the referees and coaches by trusting their judgment and integrity
- 14. Be alert to prevent accidents from flying pucks and other avoidable situations
- 15. Respect locker rooms as private area for players, coaches and officials
- 16. Be supportive after the game. Win or lose, recognize good effort, teamwork and sportsmanship

By signing this document, I agree to uphold the IceTime Sports Youth Hockey Code of Conduct that is in direct accordance with the standards of USA Hockey, NY Hockey and the Polar Bears League. I understand that if I do not follow this Code of Conduct, I may be asked to leave the team activity or I may be asked to withdraw my child from IceTime Sports Youth Hockey.

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ICETIME SPORTS COMPLEX'S LOCKER ROOM POLICY

In addition to the development of our hockey players and enjoyment of the sport of hockey, the safetyand protection of our participants is central to IceTime Sports Complex's goals. Ice-Time Sports Complex adheres to USAHockey's SafeSport Program as a means to help protect its participants from physical abuse, sexual abuse and other types of misconduct, including emotional abuse, bullying, threats, harassment and hazing. To help prevent abuse or misconduct from occurring in our locker rooms, IceTime Sports Complex has adopted the following locker room policy. This policy is designed to maintain personal privacy as well as to reduce the risk of misconduct in locker rooms.

At IceTime Sports Complex there are a number of locker rooms available for our program's use. Some teams in our program may also occasionally or regularly travel to play games at other arenas, and those locker rooms, rest rooms and shower facilities will vary from location to location. IceTime Sports Complex's team organizers will attempt to provide information on the locker room facilities in advance of games away from our home arena. At arenas for which you are unfamiliar, parents should plan to have extra time and some flexibility in making arrangements for their child to dress, undress and shower if desired.

Locker Room Monitoring

IceTime Sports Complex has predictable and limited use of locker rooms and changing areas (e.g., generally 30-45 minutes before and following practices and games). This allows for direct and regular monitoring of locker room areas. While constant monitoring inside of locker rooms and changing areas might be the most effective way to prevent problems, we understand that this would likely make some players uncomfortable and may even place our staff at risk for unwarranted suspicion. We conduct a sweep of the locker rooms and changing areas before players arrive, and if the coaches are not inside the locker rooms, either a coach or voluntary locker room monitors (each of which has been screened) will be posted directly outside of the locker rooms and changing areas during periods of use, and leave the doors open only when adequate privacy is still possible, so that only participants (coaches and players), approved team personnel and family members are permitted in the locker room. Team personnel will also secure the locker room appropriately during times when the team is on the ice.

Parents in Locker Rooms

Except for players at the younger age groups, we discourage parents from entering locker rooms unless it is truly necessary. If a player needs assistance with his or her uniform or gear, if the player is or may be injured, or a player's disability warrants assistance, then we ask that parents let the coach know beforehand that he or she will be helping the player. Naturally, with our youngest age groups it is necessary for parents to assist the players getting dressed. We encourage parents to teach their players as young as possible how to get dressed so that players will learn as early as possible how to get dressed independently. In circumstances where parents are

permitted in the locker room, coaches are permitted to ask that the parents leave for a short time before the game and for a short time after the game so that the coaches may address the players. As players get older, the coach may in his or her discretion prohibit parents from a locker room.

Mixed Gender Teams

Some of our teams consist of both male and female players. It is important that the privacy rights of all of our players are given consideration and appropriate arrangements made. Where possible, IceTime Sports Complex will have the male and female players dress/undress in separate locker rooms and then convene in a single locker room before the game or team meeting. Once the game or practice is finished, the players may come to one locker room for a team meeting and then the male and female players proceed to their separate locker rooms to undress and shower, if available. If separate locker rooms are not available, then the players will take turns using the locker room to change. We understand that these arrangements may require that players arrive earlier or leave later to dress, but believe that this is the most reasonable way to accommodate and respect all of our players.

Cell Phones and Other Mobile Recording Devices

Cell phones and other mobile devices with recording capabilities, including voice recording, still cameras and video cameras, are not permitted to be used in the locker rooms. If phones or other mobile devices must be used, they should be taken outside of the locker room.

Prohibited Conduct and Reporting

IceTime Sports Complex prohibits all types of physical abuse, sexual abuse, emotional abuse, bullying, threats, harassment and hazing, all as described in the USA Hockey SafeSport Handbook. Participants, employees or volunteers in IceTime Sports Complex may be subject to disciplinary action for violation of these locker room policies or for engaging in any misconduct or abuse or that violates the USA Hockey SafeSport Policies. If IceTime Sports Complex Youth Hockey decides it is appropriate for them to deal with the situation they will follow the procedure outlined below:

- 1. Reconciliation by getting the parties together. It may be that a genuine apology solves the problem
- 2. If this fails the board of directors will perform a full investigation. They will meet with the parent(s) and child alleging the bullying to get the details of the allegation. Minutes should be taken for clarity, which should be agreed by all as a true account
- They will also meet with the alleged bully and parent(s) and put the issue raised to them to answer and give their view of the allegation. Minutes should again be taken and agreed
- 4. If bullying in their view has taken place the individual will be warned and put on notice of further action i.e. temporary or permanent suspension if the bullying continues. Consideration should be given as to whether a reconciliation meeting between parties is appropriate at this time

 All coaches involved with both individuals should be made aware of the concerns and outcome of the process i.e. the warning or suspension

In the case of adults reported to be bullying anyone under 18

- A coach or board member should always be informed and will advise on the action to be taken
- 2. More serious cases may be referred to the local Police

Prevention

- IceTime Sports Complex Youth Hockey will have a written Code of Conduct, which includes what is acceptable and proper behavior for all members of which the anti-bullying policy is one part
- All IceTime Sports Complex Youth Hockey players, parents,, board members and officials will sign to accept the Code of Conduct before the season begins

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WAIVER OF LIABILITY, RELEASE ASSUMPTION OF RISK & INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

It is the purpose of this agreement to exempt, waive and relieve releases from liability for personal injury, property damage, and wrongful death, including if caused by negligence, including the negligence, if any, of releasees. "Releasees" include USA Hockey, Inc., its affiliate associations, local associations, member teams, event hosts, other participants, coaches, officials, sponsors, advertisers, and each of them, their officers, directors, agents and employees.

For and in consideration of the undersigned participant's registration with USA Hockey, Inc., its affiliates, local associations and member teams (all referred to together as USAH) and being allowed to participate in USAH events and member team activities, participant (and the parent(s) or legal guardian(s) of participant, if applicable) waive, release and relinquish any and all claims for liability and cause(s) of action, including for personal injury, property damage or wrongful death occurring to participant, arising out of participation in USAH events, member team activities, the sport of ice hockey, and/or activities incidental thereto, whenever or however they occur and for such period said activities may continue, and by this agreement any such claims, rights, and causes of action that participant (and participant's parent(s) or legal guardian(s), if applicable) may have are hereby waived, released and relinquished, and participant (and parent(s)/ guardian(s), if applicable) does(do) so on behalf of my/our and participant's heirs, executors, administrators and assigns.

Participant (and participant's parent(s)/guardian(s), if applicable) acknowledge, understand and assume all risks relating to ice hockey and any member team activities, and understand that ice hockey and member team activities involve risks to participant's person including bodily injury, partial or total disability, paralysis and death, and damages which may arise therefrom and that I/we have full knowledge of said risks. These risks and dangers may be caused by the negligence of the participant or the negligence of others, including the "releasees" identified below. These risks and dangers include, but are not limited to, those arising from participating with bigger, faster and stronger participants, and these risks and dangers will increase if participant participates in ice hockey and member team activities in an age group above that which participant would normally participate in. I/We further acknowledge that there may be risks and

dangers not known to us or not reasonably foreseeable at this time. Participant (and participant's parent(s)/guardian(s), if applicable) acknowledge, understand and agree that all of the risks and dangers described throughout this agreement, including those caused by the negligence of participant and/or others, are included within the waiver, release and relinquishment described in the preceding paragraph. I/We agree to abide by and be bound under the rules of USA Hockey, including the By-Laws of the corporation and the arbitration clause provisions, as currently published. Copies are available to USA Hockey members upon written request.

Participant (and participant's parent(s)/guardian(s), if applicable) acknowledge, understand and assume the risks, if any, arising from the conditions and use of ice hockey rinks and related premises and acknowledge and understand that included within the scope of this waiver and release is any cause of action (including any cause of action based on negligence) arising from the performance, or failure to perform, maintenance, inspection, supervision or control of said areas and for the failure to warn of dangerous conditions existing at said rinks, for negligent selection of certain releasees, or negligent supervision or instruction by releasees.

Participant (and participant's parent(s)/guardian(s), if applicable) agree if any claim for participant's personal injury or wrongful death is commenced against releasees, he/she shall defend, indemnify and save harmless releasees from any and all claims or causes of action by whomever or wherever made or presented for participant's personal injuries, property damage or wrongful death.

Participant (and participant's parent(s)/guardian(s), if applicable) acknowledge that they have been provided and have read the above paragraphs and have not relied upon any representations of releasees, that they are fully advised of the potential dangers of ice hockey and understand these waivers and releases are necessary to allow amateur ice hockey to exist in its present form. Significant exclusions may apply to USA Hockey's insurance policies, which could affect any coverage. For example, there is no liability coverage for claims of one player against another player. ANTI-BULLYING POLICIES

Statement of Intent

We are committed to providing a caring, friendly and safe environment for all of our members so they can participate in ice hockey in a relaxed and secure atmosphere. Bullying of any kind is unacceptable at IceTime Sports Complex Youth Hockey. If bullying does occur, all members or parents should be able to tell and know that incidents will be dealt with promptly and effectively. We are a Telling Program. This means that anyone who knows that bullying is happening is expected to tell a Mid-Hudson Polar Bear coach or board member.

What is Bullying?

- Bullying is the use of aggression with the intent of hurting another person.
- Bullying results in pain and stress to the victim.

Bullying can be:

- Emotional being unfriendly, excluding (emotionally and physically), sending hurtful text messages, tormenting, (e.g. hiding equipment or hockey bag, threatening gestures)
- Physical pushing, kicking, hitting, punching or any use of violence
- Racist racial taunts, graffiti, gestures
- Sexual unwanted physical contact or sexually abusive comments
- Homophobic because of, or focusing on the issue of sexuality
- Verbal name calling, sarcasm, spreading rumors, teasing

Why is it important to Respond to Bullying?

Bullying hurts and no one deserves to be a victim of bullying. Everyone has the right to be treated with respect. Individuals who are bullying need to learn different ways of behaving. IceTime. Sports Complex Youth Hockey has a responsibility to respond promptly and effectively to issues of bullying.

Objectives of this Policy

All IceTime Sports Complex Youth Hockey players, coaches, officials and parents should have any understanding of what bullying is. All IceTime Sports Complex Youth Hockey members, officials and coaching staff should know what the program's policy is on bullying and follow it when reported.

All players and parents should know what the program's policy is on bullying, and what they should do if bullying arises. As an organization we take bullying seriously. Players and Parents should be assured that they will be supported when bullying is reported. Bullying at IceTime Sports Complex Youth Hockey will not be tolerated.

Signs and Indicators of Bullying

A child may indicate by signs that he or she is being bullied. Parents, Coaches and Board Members should be aware of these possible signs and investigate if a child:

- Says he or she is being bullied
- Doesn't want to go to team events
- Becomes withdrawn, anxious, or lacking in confidence
- Feels ill before practice or games

- Comes home with torn clothes or damaged equipment
- Asks for money often
- Has unexplained cuts and bruises
- Won't say what's wrong or gives improbable excuses for any of the above

In more extreme cases a child:

- Starts stammering
- Cries themselves to sleep at night or has nightmares
- Becomes aggressive, disruptive or unreasonable
- Is bullying other children or siblings
- Stops eating
- Attempts or threatens suicide or runs away

These signs and behaviors may indicate other problems, but bullying should be considered a possibility and it should be investigated.

Procedures

- 1. Report bullying incidents to a coach or board member
- In cases of serious bullying, the incidents may be reported to the Local Police Department
- 3. Parents should be informed and will be asked to attend a meeting to discuss the issue
- 4. The bullying behavior or threats of bullying must be investigated and stopped immediately
- An attempt will be made to help the bully (bullies) change their behavior
- 6. If mediation fails and the bullying continues, IceTime Sports Youth Hockey will initiate disciplinary action under the bylaws
